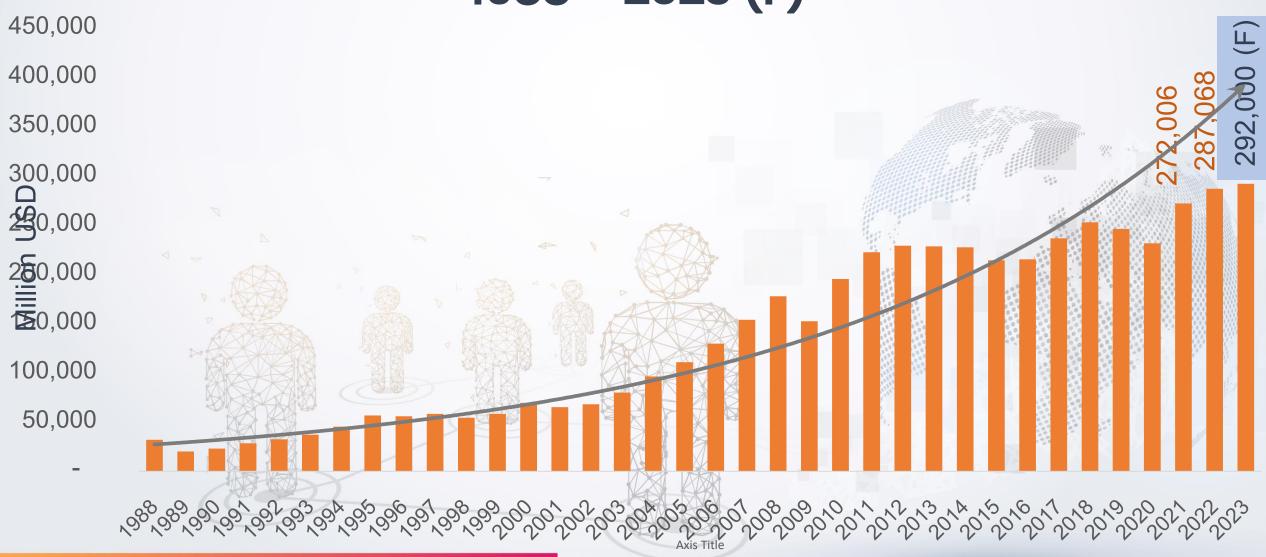

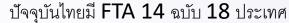

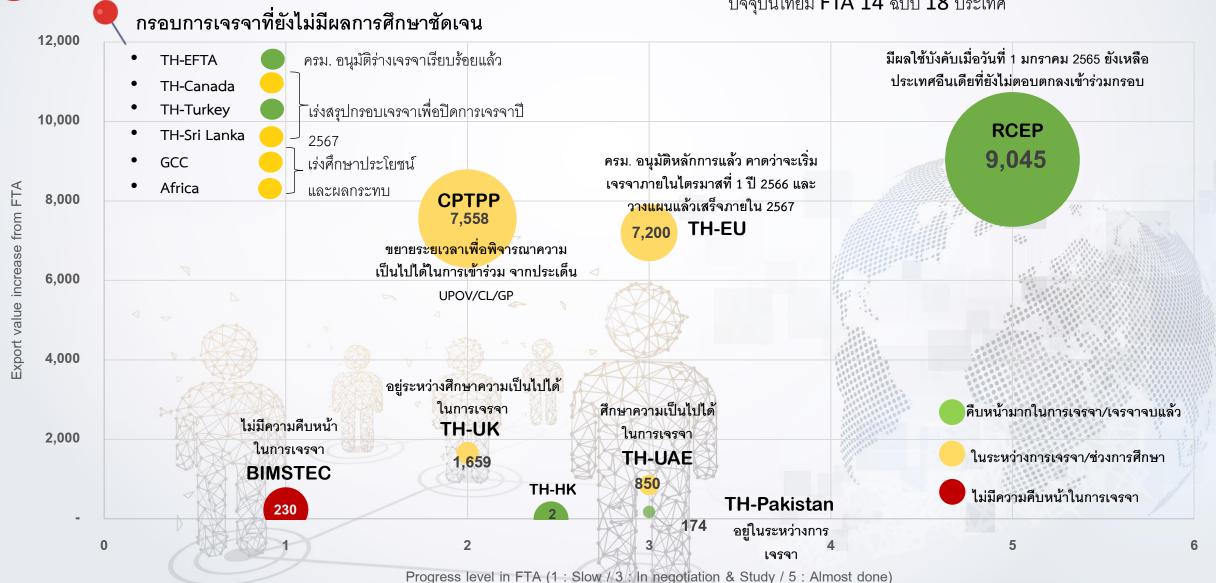

Thailand FTA Progress VS Increasing Export volume





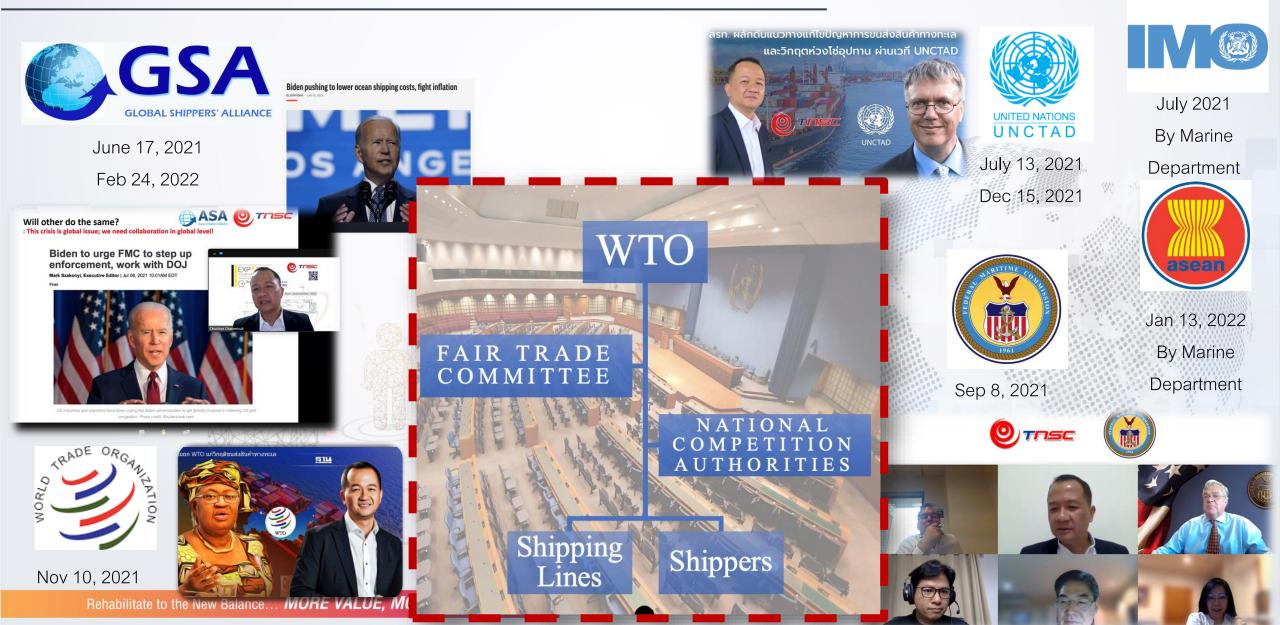

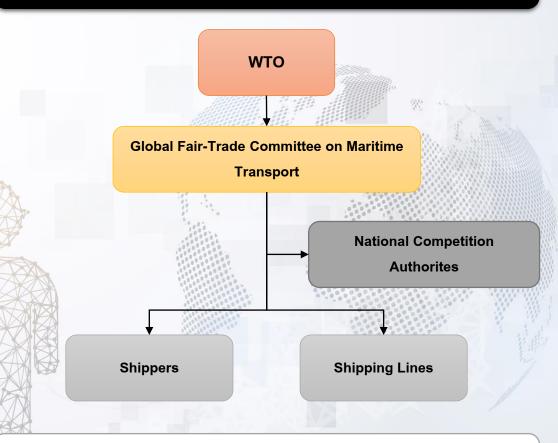

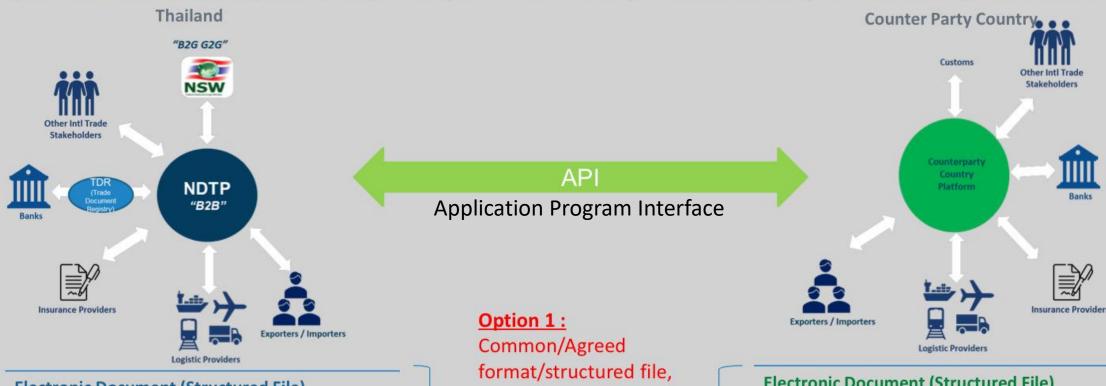
- Contracts terms should be fair and balanced
- Reliability of the sailing schedules
- Service calls accurately and swiftly reported
- No shows by shipper vs. roll-overs by carrier
- Imposition of surcharges by carrier should be limited to unforeseeable temporary external events. Duplication of surcharges billing, should be prohibited.
- Detention and demurrage should be appropriately evidenced
- Quality of empty containers delivered
- Trustable carbon footprint information and digital documentation

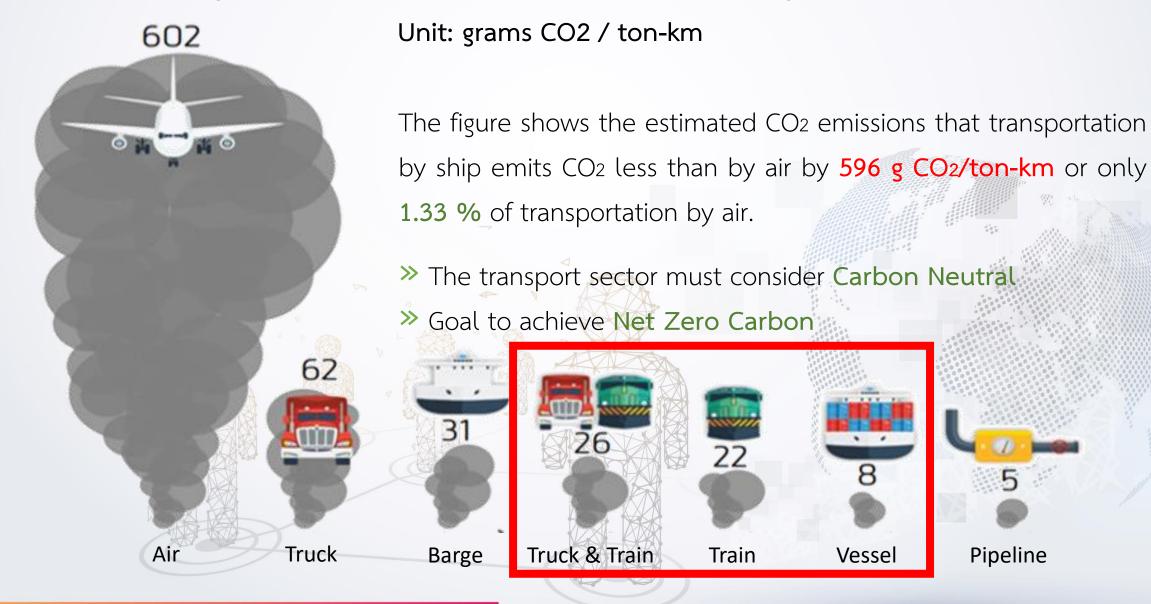

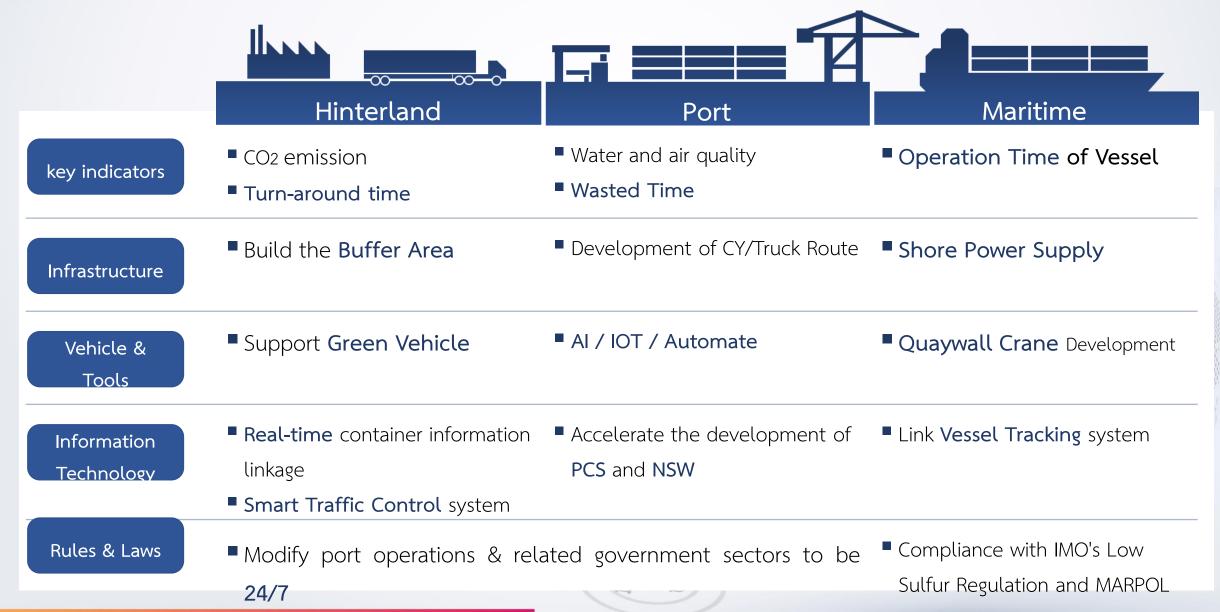
Examples of CO₂ emissions from the transport sectors

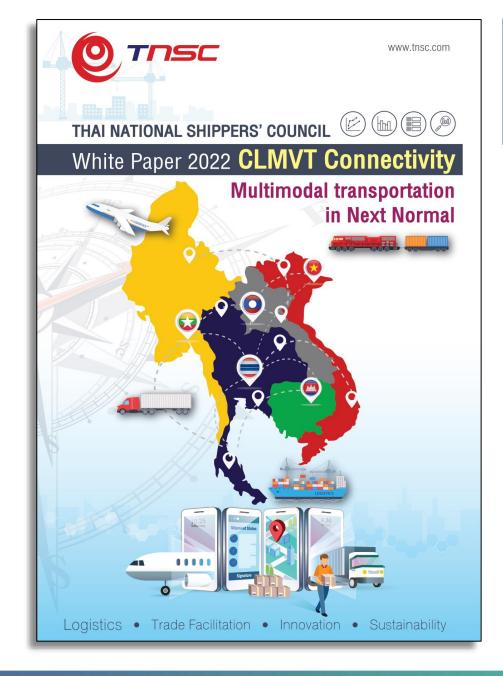

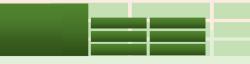
Recommendations of Transportation to China & CLMV countries

Rail & Road Recommendations



- Proposed the establishment of Common Control Area (CCA) for joint inspection between 3-4 countries on the route
- Raise the level of ICD in key areas
- Set up ICD around Bangkok
- Logistics Park / Inland Distribution Center
- Utilization of the CBTA Agreement to Facilitate Transportation
- Concessions for rail systems to be operated by the private sector in order to be able to invest in facilities
- locate space to support value-added activities and management activities of products in the form of logistics industrial estates

Other Recommendations



- Use a centralized trading platform to link with Stakeholders such as NDTP
- Study and set a standard of containers
- Establish a Joint Trade Committee
- Leveraging Existing Legacy Infrastructure and push improvements in soft side regulation and facilitation

Maritime Recommendations

- Technical support & capability development of maritime transport between Thailand and neighboring countries in the sub-region
- Hinterland connectivity Infrastructure development, Increase the capacity for larger ships, Port Automation Support, E-port and Intermodal Facilities Development
- Encourage international cooperation to create bargaining power against shipping lines (Fair Trade Committee)
- Study the benefits of the Chumphon-Ranong Landbridge Project
- Develop and promote waterway transport, Elevate the standard of Coastal Feeder, Promote Coastal Shipping, Inland Waterway and Short Sea Shipping Network between CLMVT countries







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
